

MARKER LOGATION: 301 N. Live Oak. Courthouse Grounds, Rockport

Marker Text: Created out of the coastal portion of Refugio County in 1871, Aransas County is the second smallest county in Texas. Within its boundaries are three bays of the Gulf of Mexico: Copano, St. Charles, and Aransas. The area was the site of early Indian inhabitation and Spanish exploration, as well as Anglo colonization efforts of the 1830s and 1840s. Aransas County communities are supported by such industries as fishing, agriculture, off-shore oil production, bird watching, and tourism. The county is home to the Aransas National Wildlife Refuge, created in 1937. (1990)





MARKER LOCATION: 617 S. Water Street, Rockport



Marker Text: Located on the waterfront in a community that has survived many hurricanes, this house was built about 1868 by Dr. John W. Baylor. In addition to his medical practice Dr. Baylor owned a local meat packing business, ranched, and worked to bring a railroad to the county. Schoolteachers Elisha (1857-1933) and Irene (1865-1944) Norvell moved to Rockport from Goliad in 1888 and rented the house before buying it in 1890. Elisha also worked as an agent for the San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railroad and was a realtor. Irene, a musician, sold the house in 1935. (1991)

Cementerio San Antonio de Padua



Marker Text: According to local lore, George Lewis (1859-1895) donated one-half acre of land at this site to the Hispanic citizens of the area for use as a cemetery, provided that he be buried in the center of the land. Handmade stones indicate burials dating from the 19th century; the first recorded deed was signed in 1933. Years of wind and rain have rendered many stones illegible. A number of children who died in an influenza epidemic in 1940 and many veterans of U.S. and international conflicts are interred here. A statue of San Antonio holding a child, crafted in Mexico, was brought across the border by the local priest for placement in an open chapel on the cemetery grounds. It is revered by the families of those interred here. (1998)

First Baptist Church Of Rockport

MARKER LOCATION: 1515 N. Live Oak, Rockport

Marker Text: Organized in 1873, the First Baptist Church of Rockport originally was located on S. Church Street. L. D. Young served as the first pastor. The hurricane of 1919 destroyed the first church building, but the members built a new structure at the corner of Live Oak and Main Streets the following year. They joined with Rockport's Methodist and Episcopal congregations to form an ecumenical Sunday School. Throughout its history, the First Baptist Church of Rockport has served the community with a variety of worship, educational, and outreach programs. (1991)

301 E. Main Street, Rockport

Marker Text: The Methodist Church has been in existence in Rockport since about 1870. The Rev. H. G. Horton was assigned as pastor of the Rockport church in 1872. The original Methodist church building, erected at the corner of Live Oak and Bay Streets, was used by a number of other congregations until their own facilities were completed. The Methodists relocated to this site in 1914 and later built new structures to meet the needs of the growing membership. With an emphasis on educational programs, this church continues to be an integral part of the community. (1991)



MARKER LOCATION: 1797 Bayshore Drive, Rockport



Marker Text: Dubbed "Nine Mile Point" by early settlers, this island was first used commercially by the Cushman Meat Packing Company in the late 1860s. Austrian Franz Joseph Frandolig, a horseman who had delivered cattle to Cushman & Co., homesteaded property at this site when the company vacated the land in 1878. Frandolig and his family established a large fig orchard. They sold the fruits and vegetables in Rockport and Fulton. Frandolig also kept a vineyard, where he produced and sold wine by the barrel, and built a salt works. The Frandolig family sold the property between 1901 and 1903. The severe hurricane of 1919 returned the island to its natural and uninhabited state. In 1958 the local navigation district began to offer it for development. (1999)

Marker Text: Located on Aransas Bay, the city of Fulton has a history closely associated with the fishing and shipping industry. The town was K

founded in 1867 by George Ware Fulton, whose mansion is an important local landmark. Schools, churches, and businesses were quickly established in the town. A one-room schoolhouse, built in 1886, was relocated and adapted for use as a city hall. In recent years tourism and commercial fishing and shrimping have become the city's most important economic

pursuits. The city of Fulton was incorporated in 1978. (1988)



Hagar, Connie

Marker Text: (June 14, 1886 - November 29, 1973) Born Conger Neblett in Corsicana, and married to Jack Hagar in 1926, Connie Hagar received early training as a musician. She and her sister became interested in birds and worked as volunteers with the U.S. Biological Survey. The Hagars moved to Rockport in 1935, shortly after Connie made her first visit here. She became a self-taught authority on Texas birds, and her expertise was sought by professionals and amateur ornithologists from around the world. In 1945 the Texas Legislature designated this waterfront property as the Connie Hagar Wildlife Sanctuary. (1990)

Heldenfels Shipyard


MARKER LOGATION: 1800 S. Church Street (Loop 70), Rockport

> Marker Text: Shipping industries flourished on the Rockport waterfront by the 1880s. Heldenfels Shipyard was established here on 12.9 acres in October 1917. Four 281-foot wooden cargo vessels were to be built for military use in World War I; the "Baychester" was launched on July 31, 1919, and the "Zuniga" on September 9, 1919. At the height of construction, over 900 men were employed at the shipyard. The need for ships fell as the war ended. Despite hurricane damage to the shipyard on September 14, 1919, the "Jasper" and the "Manchester" were completed as barges in 1920, ending this vital war contract. (1996)

Marker Text: The ruins of this rendering vat mark the location of the Marion Packing Co. (spelled "Meriam" in some records), one of the dozen or more meat packing plants built in the Rockport-Fulton area in the 1860s and 1870s to process the huge herds of range cattle that roamed Texas after the Civil War. Here beef was dried, salted, or pickled before shipping. The by-products such as tallow, hides, horns, and bones were sent to eastern factories. Like most of the coastal plants, Marion Packing Co. flourished until about 1880, when shipping cattle to northern markets proved more profitable. (1976)


The role of the Aransas County Historical Commission (ACHC) is to coordinate and advocate for historical preservation in the county. Commissioners are appointed by the County Commissioner's Court. As a body the ACHC works with the County Commissioner's Court and the Texas Historical Commission (THC) to preserve the county's heritage for the use, education, enjoyment and economic benefit of present and future generations. Meetings are open to the public, held quarterly as posted by the County Clerk.



Marker Text: Danish native Andrew Sorenson (1864-1941), established a reputation as a hunting and fishing guide in this area in the early 20th century. He bought 240 acres of land (.5 mi. W) in 1909 and in 1912 incorporated the private Port Bay Hunting and Fishing Club. Charter members included prominent citizens from Texas and the U.S. Adjacent waters teem with ducks and geese in season. Despite hurricane damage to club structures over the years and a reduction in size to 46 acres of land, the club continues to attract members who embrace the traditions of conservation and sportsmanship. 

> Marker Text: The town of Rockport was founded by cattlemen J. M. and T. H. Mathis in 1867. Originally a part of Refugio County, it became county seat of newly formed Aransas County in 1871. Shipping and fishing provided the primary economic base of the town in its early years. The railroad arrived in 1888 and with it came a decline in the shipping industry, although shipyards were in operation during World War I and World War II. Rockport has been a popular recreation center over the years, and tourism continues to be important to the local economy. (1988)

Rockport Cemetery

Marker Text: This cemetery has served the citizens of Rockport and Fulton for over a century. The oldest marked grave is that of Emma Fulton (d. 1876), grand-daughter of George Ware Fulton, who was instrumental in the development of the area and was interred in the cemetery in 1893. A large number of burials took place here in 1918, the year of a devastating influenza epidemic. The cemetery contains the graves of veterans of the Texas Revolution, Civil War, World War I, World War II, Korea, and Vietnam. The Rockport Cemetery Association maintains the historic graveyard. (1988)



MARKER LOCATION: 619 N. Live Oak, Rockport



Marker Text: Rockport School has served the Town of Rockport for many years as both an educational and community institution. It dates to 1953, during the era of the Great Depression. One of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal Programs to combat the depression was the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, later the Public Works Administration (PWA), part of the National Industrial Recovery Act. Workers completed construction on the Rockport School, labeled Project Number 2813, under the PWA, and local bonds helped to subsidize the government project.

The district had the structure built on the site of an earlier Rockport school, a wooden structure dating to 1892. When the new school opened, it housed eleven grades before adding the twelfth a few years later for full accreditation.

Rockport School served the community for many years while undergoing several changes. After World War II, a former Army Air Force building provided space for a gymnasium and classroom addition utilized until the late 1950s. After construction of a new high school in the city in 1953, district officials converted this building into an elementary school and renamed it Rockport Elementary. In 2005, after the school closed, it became a community center.

This zigzag modern building features a dramatic stylized sunburst over the entryway. Other features include a running course of brickwork detailing and symmetrical regular massing. (2006)



Marker Text: During its early years Rockport relied on Gulf shipping for goods and services. After the arrival of the San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railroad in 1888, however, the town's economic focus changed to include rail shipping and a burgeoning tourism industry. The town's population grew from 600 in 1888 to 2,500 by 1890. Businesses and hotels were built to serve the new tourism trade, and four trains arrived at the Rockport Depot daily. By the 1940s passenger rail service to Rockport ended. Freight service continued until 1985, when highway trucking replaced railroad service. (1994)

Marker Text: In March 1948, Mrs. Fred B. Hunt issued a call to organize the Woman's Civic Club. One of the Club's major early activities was financing a permanent building for the organization. Later that year, the recreation building for Humble Oil Company employees at Ingleside went up for auction, and the club put in a bid that was accepted. The building was then brought to Rockport in three sections by barge. The hip roof, rectangular plan building features a five-bay entrance porch with stone columns, banks of paired windows along each side and an Austin stone veneer. (2009)

Other Historical Points of Interest

Goose Island State Park - Civilian Conservation Corps remnants. Contains picnic sites, shelters, camping and RV sites, boat launch, group pavilion, playground, bird walks, wetlands pond and nature trails. Take SH 35 north to Park Road 13 and follow signs.

Big Tree of Lamar - A giant live oak, charter member of the Live Oak Society. More than 35 feet in circumference at a point four feet above ground level, with a crown spread of 89 feet, the top branch is 44 feet above ground level. Said to have been a council tree for the Karankawa Indians. Take SH 35 north and follow signs to water.

<u>Schoenstatt Convent and Chapel</u> - A Catholic retreat and teaching center. Mass on Sunday mornings. Chapel is replica of one in Germany. Take SH 35 north to Park Road 13, turn right and watch signs.

<u>Paws & Taws Convention Center</u> - Home of square dance club. Community Center. Built by volunteers in 1965. Located on north end of Fulton Harbor.

Central Area Historic Homes and City/County Offices:

- 509 South Live Oak This home was originally built in 1880 in Oklahoma, a community two miles south of this location. It was moved by barge when Oklahoma failed. The home was the birthplace of the first child born in Aransas County, David Rockport Scrivener, (b.1868) who with his wife lived here for many years.
- 203 North Magnolia The R.H. Wood home was built in the winter of 1867-68. His son, William W. Wood, was born here in 1871. Col. John H. Wood, father of R.H. Wood, was one of the founders of Rockport and a leader in the cattle industry.
- 902 Cornwall -The L.M. Bracht home was also built in Oklahoma in 1881 by F.C. Finney, the developer. The Brachts moved the home here in 1889. The R.M. Bracht home at Magnolia and Concho was built in 1885. It was remodeled after Hurricane Celia (1970) & again after a 1985 fire.
- 910 Concho One of the homes that A. Bruhl, a prominent druggist, owned is now located at 910 Concho after being moved from the corner of Allen & Nopal streets.

The County Courthouse, Tax Assessor/Collector's office, Fire and Police Departments & Aransas County Library are in the 300 blocks of Live Oak & Church streets. The City Hall is at the corner of Pearl & Market streets.

<u>Site of Rockport Yacht and Supply Co.</u> – Also known as RYSCO, was a world supplier of crew and supply boats, shrimp, fish & oyster trawlers and specialty boats. A portion of the shipyard was formerly the Rice Shipyard, which built sub-chasers & rescue ships during World War II.

<u>Simon Michael School and Gallery of Fine Arts</u> - At 510 East King Street is a nationally acclaimed art school and gallery.

The Rockport Center for the Arts – The blue building is the home of the Rockport Art Association, Inc. This was a home originally built in 1890 and located at 901 Broadway. It was donated to the Art Association by Tom O'Connor in 1982. Open Tuesday through Saturday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sunday 1 to 4 p.m.

<u>Veteran's Memorial</u> – Located at the corner of Austin Street and South Navigation Circle. Dedicated November 11, 1984, it honors Aransas County veterans and lists those who gave their lives in World War II, Korea and Vietnam, with separate markers honoring women veterans and prisoners of war (POWs).

South Area Historic Homes on Church Street:

Several homes from the 1880s and 1890s.

- 702 South Church The small tin-roofed building was once the Methodist parsonage.
- 712 South Church The gray home was built in the early 1890s, abandoned about 50 years later, and recently restored.
- 717 South Church The blue home across the street was built in the late 1880s by Charles Bailey. He was the owner of the first newspaper in the county and also owned an over-the-water pavilion. The home stayed in the family until the mid 1970s.
- 801 South Church The two-story gray home was originally built on Austin Street in 1874 by Judge Hynes. It was moved to this location in 1906 and the second story was added. Cypress and Louisiana pine were used in the construction. The home was restored after being damaged by Hurricane Celia in 1970.

One block west of the Bailey home is a city park where Zachary Taylor's army camped on the way to Mexico in 1845.

Texas Maritime Museum – Explore the rich maritime heritage of Texas – from Spanish exploration to the delights of coastal fishing and more. Exhibits, art & artifacts, models, hands-on displays and fun.


