

DISASTER DECLARATION RENEWAL ORDER

ORDER #DRO-18-2021

WHEREAS, Aransas County, Texas, on the 7th day of September, 2018, suffered widespread or severe property damage, and threatens injury or loss of life resulting from the severe weather and flooding, occurring in the County beginning on September 7th and continuing through September 16th, 2018; and

WHEREAS, this event also caused significant damage to roads and community infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the excess flooding and water has caused a major outbreak of disease carrying pests and mosquitos posing a significant threat to public health; and

WHEREAS, Aransas County, Texas, has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect community assets and rehabilitate property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED by Judge C.H. "Burt" Mills, Jr. of Aransas County, Texas:

That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for Aransas County pursuant to §418.108(a) of the *Texas Government Code*.

Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the *Texas Government Code*, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by Aransas County.

Pursuant to §418.108(h) of the *Texas Government Code*, the jurisdiction and authority of the County Judge includes the incorporated and unincorporated areas of Aransas County.

Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the *Texas Government Code*, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the Aransas County Clerk.

Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the *Texas Government Code*, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the Aransas County Emergency Management Plan.

That this Proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
